Three qualified proponents have been shortlisted to move to the next stage in the procurement process to deliver a mine water treatment plant in Britannia Beach. The shortlisted proponents who are invited to submit detailed proposals for the project are listed below in alphabetical order.

# AMEC Americas Ltd. and Ledcor Projects Inc.

AMEC Americas Ltd and Ledcor Projects Inc will be forming a special purpose consortium for the project.

Design and procurement will be led by AMEC Americas Ltd. and construction by Ledcor Projects Inc. For operations and maintenance, AMEC will be responsible for plant operations and maintenance planning, environmental compliance and training. Further, AMEC and Ledcor will share the day-to day plant management.

#### **EPCOR Water Services Inc. and Team**

EPCOR Water Services has assembled a team that includes BioteQ Environmental Technologies Inc., and Lockerbie Stanley Inc. (Stantec Consulting Ltd.)

EPCOR Water Services Inc, BioteQ Environmental Technologies Inc., and Lockerbie Stanley Inc. will work together to design the Plant and technology process. Lockerbie Stanley Inc will construct the Project using technology from BioTeQ Environmental Technology and EPCOR Water Services Inc. The operations team will be led by EPCOR Water Services Inc. with support from BioteQ Environmental Technologies Inc., Sogem, and Lafarge North America.
